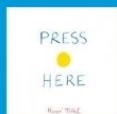

Early Literacy Tip:

"Hoo, hoo, hoo!"

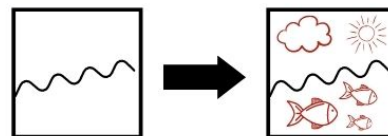
